unto my Daughter Margarett one Red Petticoat with Silver and gold lace on it  
I do will and bequeath unto my Daughter Deborah one Gold ring 3<sup>rd</sup> I do

and bequeath unto my Daughter Philadelphia one Silver Spoon. 6<sup>th</sup> I do will bequeath unto my Son that Part of my Land which both of right belong unto him. 7<sup>th</sup> I do will and bequeath unto my beloved friend John Crampton my Second Suit of Cloathing  
 8<sup>th</sup> I do will and bequeath unto my beloved friend John Tanner five hundred pounds of Tobaccos to be paid to him or his executors immediately after my decease. 9<sup>th</sup> I do will and desire that W<sup>m</sup> John Brown and W<sup>m</sup> John Baker, my well beloved Friends may be joint Executors of this my last Will and Testaments & that all the Remainder of my movables both within doors and without may be sold to an Outcry and that the Children be put to school, and that their schooling may be Paid for out of the Estate & for what doth remain of the Estate, may be equally divided among the three Children when they do come of age and if they do all chance to die before they do come of age, then that it be given unto the other two that shall remain alive.
