our Lord God. 1698 I Original Broune of Washington Parish in the County
of Westmoreland being sick of Body, but of Perfect mind and memory thank
be given to God Therefor, calling to mind the mortality of my body & knowing that it
is appointed for all men once to die doe make and ordaine this my last Will
and Testament in manner and form following, first & principally I give

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my Soul into the hands of God who gave it me and for my body I commend it to
the Earth to be buried in Christian & decent manner as to my Executors hereafter
named shall be thought meet and convenient, nothing doubting but at the general
resurrection I shall receive the same again, by the mighty Power of God, and as
touching such worldly estate, wherewith it hath Pleas'd God to bless me with in this
life I give and devise bequath and Dispose the same in manner & form following
First I give and bequath unto my Daughter Jane Pope one Chest of Drawers:

of the aforesaid Legacy, Item I give unto my Son William Brown One Riding horse
two Saddles, bridle halter, one case of Pistols and a pair of Holsters and one
Bayonett, Item I give unto my Son William Browne, one Maid of three years
old with her increase, Item I give unto my Son William Brown all my Guns

two Negroes named Coffey and Diana, to be delivered to him at the full
age of Twenty One with all their Increase from this time to that and
here,

that, and there increase afterwards, to him and his heirs, but if my said son
 should die before he comes to the age of One & Twenty or after should die
 without any heir of his body, that then the said Negroes with their aforesaid
 Increase, and every particular legacy, which I have unto my aforesaid son
 William Brown to return to the next heir at Law; Item I give unto my
 well beloved Wife Jane all the residue of my Estate both of Cattle horses hay
 Corn Tobacco, household Goods and all manner of my Estate whatsoever
 excepting what I here next give; Item I give unto Laurence Abington
 all my wearing Cloaths in general, Item it is my will and pleasure that
 my Executors shall first Pay my debts and then my legacies, Item it is my
 will and pleasure that my well beloved Wife Jane be full and sole
 Executrix of this my last Will and Testament, But if my said Wife should
 in any case Imbezill make away or strive to defraud my said Children
 of any part or Parcel of any of the mentioned legacies which I have given
 them, then it is my desire that my esteemed friends Capt Laurence Washington
 and Mr Caleb Butler whom I empower & Intrust as overseers over my
 Children and their estates, to take my said Children & their Estates into their
 Custody, and I desire my said two overseers carefully to look after my said
 Children and their estates, during the time of their minority, untill they come
 to the specified time, which I have left them of age, Item It is my will and
 Pleasure that if Mark Cullum should have Opportunity of getting the Place

him during the time that I have left him to be of age provided he
followeth the sea^s as Master; but if the said Mark Cullum should not
attaine the Office aforesaid, that then my said Son William Brown the last
four Years of capering of his age be bound Apprentice to a Carpenter
Millwright or Tayner: Item I doe hereby utterly disallow, revoke and
Annulle all and every other former Testaments wills legacies, Executors or
testes, by me in any wise before this time named willed & bequeathed
Statifying & Confirming this and none other to be my last Will and Tes-
tament, In Witness whereof I have hereunto sett my hand and
