unto Death when it shall please God to call a man or a woman
and declare this my last Will and Testament in maner and form following
revoking and annulling by these presents all and every Will and Testament
heretofore by me made or declared either by writing or word and this to
be taken only for my last Will and Testament and none other, and first
being Penitent
