In The Name of God amen the second day of June anno Dom 1691 I Richard Sloman of Cople Parish in Westmoreland County in the state of Virginia being weak in body but of sound and Perfect memory thanks be to Almighty God and calling to Remembrance the uncertain State of this Transitory Life, and that all flesh must yield unto Death, when it shall please God to Call, do make Constitute, ordain & declare this my last Will and Testament in manner and form following, Nowliking and Disannulling by these presents all and every Testament and Testaments by me made and declared either by word or writing & to be taken only to be my last Will & Testament and none other: And First, being penitent and sorry for my sins past from the bottom of my heart, most humbly desiring forgiveness for the same, I give and Commit my Soul to almighty God my saviour and Redemer, in whom by the merits of Jesus Christ I trust and believe assuredly to be saved and to have full Remission and forgiveness of all my Sins and that my Soul with my body at the general Day of Resurrection shall rise again with Joy and through the Mouth of blessed Death & Passion possess and inherit the Kingdom of Heaven prepared for his Elect, and my body to be buried in such Place where it shall please my executors hereafter named to appoint, and now for the settling of my Temporal Estates of such Goods, Chattels and Debts as it hath pleased God for above my deute to bestow upon me I do Ordain, give and dispose the same in manner of form following (W.H.) I will that all these Debts and dutys as I owe in right or Conscience to any man

of Person or Persons whatsoever shall be well Contented and Truly paid or
or sued to be paid within convenient time after my decease by my Executors
hereafter named. Item I give and bequeath unto my well beloved friend
John Sturman all that Plantation which I now live upon with and contain-
ing One Hundred acres of Land to be laid him out by Executors hereafter named
to have and hold to him the said John Sturman his heirs and Assigns to his and
their proper use and behoof forever; Item I give and bequeath unto my friend
John Sturman all the Right title Interest and Property which I have of and
in all and Singular the Lands in the Province of Maryland to have and hold
to him the said John Sturman his heirs and Assigns to his & their proper use &
behoof forever. Item I give and bequeath unto my said Friend John Sturman
two Negroes (viz) Harry and his wife Athey, and what Hogs belongeth to
the above said Plantation, and four of the best Steers to have and hold the
said Negroes, Hogs and Steers to him the said John Sturman his heirs
Executors and Adm^rs to his and their proper use and behoof forever.
Item my will is that my said Friend John Sturman shall give unto my
well beloved Friend Penelope Higgon (a woman Servant, or as much Tobacco)
as will purchase a Servant. Item I give and bequeath unto my well
beloved Friend Patrick Spence my Trooping Saddle & furniture with holsters
Pistols and Carbines to be delivered to him by my executors hereafter
named. Item I give and bequeath unto my well beloved friend Alexander
Spence One Leather Bed and Furniture with the red flowered set of Lin-
tens and Nailings to him the said Alexander Spence his heirs Executors adm^rs
and Assigns to be delivered to him by my executors hereafter named. Item
I give and bequeath unto my well beloved friend Elizabeth Hardinge all
the right title, Interest & property which I have to any Land in the Colony of
Virginia (Excepting what I have before devised) to have and to hold to her the
said Elizabeth Hardinge her heirs and Assigns to her and their proper use & behoof
forever more. Item my Will is that my said Friend John Sturman pay

two Negroes (viz) Harry and his wife Athey, and what Hogg belongs to
the above said Plantation, and four of the best Steers to have & hold the
said Negroes, Hogs and Steers to him the said John Sturman his heirs
executors and adm'rs to his and their proper use and behoof forever.
Item my will is that my said friend John Sturman shall give unto my
well beloved friend Penelope Higgins (a woman Servant, or as much Tobacco)
as will purchase a Servant. Item I give and bequeath unto my well
beloved friend Patrick Spence my Trooping Saddle & furniture with holsters
Pistols and Carbines to be delivered to him by my executors hereafter
named. Item I give and bequeath unto my well beloved friend Alexander
Spence One Leather Bed and Furniture with the red flowered set of cen-
tains and Vailings to him the said Alexander Spence his heirs executors adm'rs
and assigns to be delivered to him by my executors hereafter named. Item
I give and bequeath unto my well beloved friend Elizabeth Hardinge all
the right title, Interest & property which I have to any Land in the Colony of
Virginia (Excepting what I have before devised) to have and to hold to her the
said Elizabeth Hardinge her heirs and assigns to her and their proper use behoof
forever more. Item my will is that my said friend John Sturman pay
half the expences & charges I shall be at in England or elsewhere.
Item I give and bequeath unto my well beloved friend Elizabeth Hardinge
all the Remaining Part of movables and utensils which are belonging or
appertaining to me in any manner whatsoever (Excepting what legacies I
have bequeathed) to have and to hold to her the said Elizabeth Hardinge
her heirs executors, adm'rs and assigns to her, their proper uses and behoofs forever.
Item I do make, ordain, constitute and appoint my trusty and well beloved friend William
Hardinge to be my whole and sole executor of this my last Will and Testament In
Witnesse whereof I have hereunto set my hand and Seal the day and year first

the year of our Lord 1691. Between Darby Swillivant and Elizabeth his Wife
of the one Part and Patrick Muckleroy of the other Part Witnesseth that the said
Darby Swillivant and Elizabeth his Wife for Reccompence of the sum of five
Shillings to them in hand Paid; the Receipt whereof they do hereby acknowledge
and thereof, and every part and Parcel so fully clearly and absolutely Exonerate an-
quit and discharge the said Patrick Muckleroy his Executors by Attorneys as also for
divers other good causes and Considerations, the said Darby Swillivant, whereunto Es-
pecially moving, have Demised, Granted, Bargained and Sold, & Do by these presents for
themselves and their heirs Demise, grant, bargain and Sell unto the said Patrick
Muckleroy his Executors attornys and Assigns all that Tract or Parcel of Land to them
or either of them belonging, lying and being in the said County of Westmoreland, both
Woodland and Cleared Land together with all and Singular, Orchards Gardens, houses Es-
capes buildings, wood underwood, Timber and Timber Trees, Springs, ways, water watercours
menes Learies and all other Profits Commodities, Advantages, Emoluments, hereditaments
and Appurtenances, to the same now or at any time hereafter, held used, Occupied or en-
joyed or accepted, Repaired, taken or Known as Part, Parcel or Member thereof, or of any
part or Parcel thereof, in as full and ample manner as to all intents, Constructions
and Purposes as William Sowdall (Father of the said Elizabeth) used, Occupied or
enjoyed the same, or might or ought to have held, used, Occupied or enjoyed the same
at which said granted Promises are now in the Tenure and Actual Possession or
Occupation of the said Darby Swillivant and Elizabeth his Wife, and Margarrett
