Col<sup>o</sup> William Poole Executor of this my last Will and Testament, Item I revoke and  
burnall all other Wills legacies & bequests by me made or bequeathed, In Testimony  
whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 25<sup>th</sup> day of January Anno Dom 1697  
Signed Seal Bewiged, Declared, pronounced & published Robert Wickeff   
to be the last Will & Testament of the said Robert Wickeff.
