In the Name of God Amen I Thomas Beard being very sick & weak &  
of perfect sense and memory doth hereby make my last Will & Testament  
Item I give and bequeath my Soul to God that gave it in hopes of a  
Joyfull resurrection through Jesus Christ our Lord Amen, Dying in a faith  
and hope that Jesus Christ will raise this Vile body of Mine and make it  
like his Glorious body, and my body well and decently buried by my Executors  
as shall be decently declared hereafter, and all my worldly goods as follows  
Item I give unto my Eldest Son John Beard my now dwelling Plantation  
whereon I live with all the Land belonging to it being in two Ratings, and if my son  
John should die without an heire of his body, then it is my Wills & desire to give to  
my youngest Son Thomas Beard, and if he die without heire of his body then to my  
Daughter Mary Beard, and if my Daughter die without an heire, then to my son  
Francis Readman and his heires forever, Item I give to my eldest Son John  
Beard my riding horse bridle and Saddle, Item I give to my Son John Two  
Cows & Calves by their sides, Item I give to my Son John Beard 4 Barrows of  
four years old apiece, and 3 Pairs and one Barrow of one year old apiece, Item  
I give to my Son John also my Gun and all the rest of my movable Estate;  
And Hogs and Cattle to be equally divided between my Son Thomas  
Beard and my Daughter Mary Beard, I Appoint my Brother in Law  
Robert Readman and my Teste in Law Mary Readman to look after my  
Children fit to be my Executrix.
