ordaine this my last Will and Testament in manner and form following
Imprimis I give and bequeath my Soul to God, and my body to the Earth
from to be buried in Chrestian and decent Manner at the discouer
of my Corp. hereafter named, and as for what worldly Estate, wherewith
it hath pleased God to bless me withall I give divide and dispose of in
the following manner, and form, Item it is my Will and desire that
M^r Anne Washington do lay out what Tobacco and Money she hath of
Mine in her hand, to purchase two young Negroes at being 800 and odd pounds
of Tobacco and Ten pounds odd Money Stating as will appear by the book of
Capt. John Washington deceased, he said Negroes to be for her the said Anne
Washington if her heirs force, promised she the said Anne Washington her heirs
of^{to} shall set her Malatto boys named or commonly called Hugh & Jimmy
(sons to her Negro Woman named Black Betty) free when they the said Hugh &
Jimmy shall arrive to the age of 21 years, Item I give and bequeath
to the said Negro Woman and what of her Children shall live with her
my Bed, and Furniture, and to herself one small iron Pot of three Ells

of Holland and Three Ells of Damask, which is in my Trunk, there to be given by
 Bequeath to the aforesaid Huflye and Jimmy, Each of them a young man
 when they shall be free or at the age of Twenty one years, then I give and
 bequeath to M^r William Thompson Sen^r One Guinea, Here it is my Will & Desire
 that my Large Suite of Cloaths with one broad black Cloath Cote and calico
 vest & plush breeches of two pair of worsted stockings of one pair of Shoes and
 1/2 yard of fine Marsey of triming which is in my Trunk to be sold for Tobacco
 and the produce with the rest of my Estate whatsoever and wheresoever may
 be putt in the hands of M^r Anne Washington for the good of the aforesaid
 Black Bettys Children, to say Frank, Nelly, Peggy, Betty, Mally & Rachell, Then
 it is my Will and Desire that M^r Anne Washington would putt the younger
 boy Jimmy to School till he can read English, and that she would have him
 all Battized & taught the Christian faith and brought up in the fear of God as
 nigh as she can, and I doe hereby make constittute and ordain the aforesaid
 Anne Washington my full and whole Exec^r of this my last Will & Testament
 In witness whereof I have hereunto sett my hand and fixed my seal this
 23rd day of February 1699.
