Ordaine this my last Will and Testament in manner and form following
To wist that I give and bequeath my Soule to God, and my body to the Earth
from to be buried in Christian and decent Manner at the discretion
of my Exor. hereafter named, and as for what worldly Estate, wherewith
it hath pleased God to bless me withall I give devise and Dispose of in
the following manner, and form, Item it is my Will and desire that
M^{rs} Anne Washington doe lay out what Tobacco and Money she hath of
mine in her hands, to purchase two young Negroes at buy 800⁰ and 000 pounds
of Tobacco and Ten pounds 000 Money sterling as will appear by the book of
Capt. John Washington dees, the said Negroes to be for her the said Anne
Washington of her heirs forever, provided she the said Anne Washington her heirs
or shall sitt her two Malatto boys named or commonly called Buzge & Jimmy
(sons to her Negro Woman named Black Betty) free when they the said Buzge
& Jimmy shall arrive to the age of 21 years, Item I give and bequeath
to the said Negro Woman and what of her Children shall live with her
my Bed, and Furniture, and to herself one small Iron Potte of three Ells

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of Holland and Three Ells of Double, which is in my Trunk, I have bequeath to the aforesaid Hughie and Jimmy, Each of them a young man when they shall be free or at the age of Twenty one years, I have bequeath to M^r. William Thompson Sen^r. One Guinea, I have I do desire that my Sarge Sute of Cloath, with one broad blacke Cloath Cote and calice Vest & plush Breeches of two pair of woosted Stockings of one pair of Shoes with a yard of fine Kersay of trimming which is in my Trunk be sold for Tobacco and the produce with the rest of my Estate whatsoever and wheresoever may be putt in the hands of M^{rs}. Anne Washington for the good of the aforesaid Black Bittys Chelouen, to say Frank, Nelly, Peggy, Betty, Melly & Rachael, I have I do desire that M^{rs}. Anne Washington would putt the younger boy Jimmy to School till he can read English, and that she would have him all Bolyed & taught the Christian faith and brought up in the fear of God as much as she can, and I doe hereby make constitute and ordain the aforesaid Anne Washington my full and whole Ex^{ec} of this my last Will & Testament In Witness whereof I have hereunto sett my hand and fixed my Seale this 23rd day of February 1698
