but of sound and Perfect memory blessed be God for it doe make this my last
Will and Testament in manner and form following, hereby revoking all former
Wills, written or unwritten by me made Dated this 7th Day of Decr. 1694.

Imprimis I bequath my soul to God that gave it hoping by the Merits of
my Saviour Jesus Christ it shall at the last day be reunited to my Body
and glorified, and my body I will be, decently buried at the discretion of
my Executors hereafter named, Item I will that all my Just Debts be Justly
paid. Item I give to my dear and loving wife Anna all my Personal Estate
of what nature and quality soever, as servants, Slaves horses, Cattle Sheep
Hoggs, household Stuff and all utensels to me belonging, that shall belong
to me in my lifetime for and during her natural life: Item I give my said
Wife Anna all that tract of Land wherein I now live for & during her
Natural life off by Estimation 950. Acres of Land more or less & after her
death I will the said Land to my Grandson Youell English, Youell Watts &
their heirs, Item I give and bequath two thirds of the said Personal Estate
before mentioned to my three Grandchildren, Youel Watts, Youel English
and Thomas Spence to be delivered to them after the death of my said
Loving Wife and not before. Item I give to my Grandson Youell Watts
the Occupation of any Part of that Land wherein my Daughter Watts now
liveth excepting what shall be laid out for my Daughters thirds, and I will
that he seat himself thereon at the age of 18 years & not before, all which tract
of Land I give and bequath to my Grandson Youell Watts & his heirs forever
after the death of my said Daughter Ann Watts and not before. Item I
give and bequath +

paid. Item I give to my dear and loving wife Anna all my Personal Estate
of what nature and quality soever, as Servants, Slaves horses, Cattle Sheep
Hoggs, household Stuff and all utensels to me belonging, that shall belong
to me in my lifetime for and during her natural life: Item I give my said
Wife Anna all that tract of Land whereon I now live for & during her
Natural life of by Estimation 950. Acres of Land more or less. After her
death I will the said Land to my Grandson Youell English, Youell Watts &
their heirs, Item I give and bequeath two thirds of the said Personal Estate
before mentioned to my three Grandchildren, Youel Watts, Youel English
and Thomas Spence to be delivered to them after the death of my said
Loving Wife and not before. Item I give to my Grandson Youell Watts
the Occupation of any Part of that Land whereon my Daughter Watts now
liveth excepting what shall be laid out for my Daughters Heirs, and I will
that he seat himself thereon at the age of 18 years & not before, all which tract
of Land I give and bequeath to my Grandson Youell Watts & his heirs forever
after the death of my said Daughter Ann Watts and not before. Item I
give and bequeath to my Grandson Thomas Spence One Moiety of the Lands
I bought of Stradon to him and his heirs forever, to Possess the said Lands
at the age of 18 years and not before, the other half of the said dividend
having been formerly made over in the fee Simple of it to my Daughter
Spence in Westmoreland Court. Item I make my said Loving Wife my sole
Executrix of this my Last Will and Testament, In Witness whereof I have
hereunto put my hand and seal the day and year above Written.

1695. Item I give unto John Uttwell the benefit of the Ecclesiastical of Oliver's
Land forever. Item I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Winifred all that my
Plantation whereon one Edward Withiam now liveth containing 100 Acres or there-
abouts for her life and after her decease to Youell English her Son and his heirs
forever. Item I give and bequeath unto my said Daughter Winifred five Cows
and five Lambs and the two Steers I bought at Mr. Sittles Outing also one
Ram, Item I give and bequeath unto my dear and loving Wife the Choice
of my best feather Beds, bolster, Curtains, Wallpapers, and all other furniture be-
longing. Item my Will and meaning is that my Executors, deliver unto my three
grand children, Youell Watts, Youell English and Thomas Spence their Several
Parts of the two thirds parts of my Personal Estate within bequeathed to them as
they shall severally Attaine to their several ages of 18 years, Witness my hand &
Seal the 18 day and year above Written
