in the County of Westmoreland being of sound and Perfect memory prays  
be god doe make and Ordain this to be my last Will and Testament  
in manner and form Following In presence I bequeath my Soul unto god  
which gave it in full hopes of a Free Pardon & Reconciliation of all my  
Sins, through the merits and Satisfaction of my Lord & Saviour Jesus Christ  
and a blessed Resurrection to everlasting life & my body to the earth from  
whence it came to be decently buried at the discretion of my Executors hereafter  
named, and it is my Will and desire that noe dishonor be to my god by  
drunking immorally or other misdemeanors; Item I give devise and  
bequeath unto my son, Carnock Cox the plantation wheres he now lives  
and three hundred acres of land adjoining to the land of George

I further did and to the saids of Robert Self, to him my said son Carnoch & the heirs  
 of his body lawfully to be begotten, and for want of such issue to my son Thomas  
 Cox and the heirs of his body lawfully to be begotten, and for want of such issue to my  
 three daughters, Martha, Anne & Elizabeth, and the heirs of their bodies lawfully to  
 be begotten, I for Default of such issue to my eight heirs forever, Item I give and  
 bequeath unto my son Vincent Cox the Plantation where I now live with all  
 houses, lands, and all other appurtenances thereunto belonging and the tract of  
 land containing 346 Acres to him my said son and the heirs of his body lawfully to  
 be begotten and for want of such issue to my son Carnoch Cox and the heirs of his  
 body lawfully to be begotten, and for want of such issue to my son Thomas Cox and  
 the heirs of his body lawfully to be begotten, and for want of such issue to my three  
 daughters, Martha, Anne & Elizabeth, and the heirs of their bodies lawfully to be  
 begotten and for want of such issue to my eight heirs forever, Item I give and  
 bequeath unto my Son Thomas Cox 370 Acres of Land lying at the upper end  
 of the tract part of it called Little Wills Tolly, to him my said son Thomas and  
 the heirs of his body lawfully to be begotten and for want of such issue to my son  
 Carnoch Cox and the heirs of his body lawfully to be begotten, and for want of such  
 issue to my son Vincent Cox and the heirs of his body lawfully to be begotten & for want  
 of such issue to my three daughters, Martha, Anne, & Elizabeth and the heirs of their bodies  
 lawfully to be begotten and for Default of such issue to my eight heirs forever,  
 Item I give unto my Son Vincent Cox what monys I have in England towards  
 him at his bides, in the hands of Michael Ching, Item I give Bequeath unto  
 my Son Carnoch Cox, Ben and Betty Negroes, to him and his assigns forever &  
 to his bedch and Bolster, a Rugg and pair of Blankets & a Silver Whistle & Bells  
 Item I give and bequeath unto my Son Vincent Cox Sam<sup>le</sup> Wright of Grange Negroes  
 to be delivered to him at the age of 31 years & Leather Sand Bolster Nine & Two Bells

to Twelve, Item I give unto my Son Thomas Cox One year Schooling, Item  
I give unto my Son Barnock Vincent & Thomas Cox all the Residue of my  
Personal Estate, when my Debts & Legacies are paid, to be equally divided among  
them, and the Survivors of them, Lastly I make, Ordain and Appoint my  
Son Barnock Cox and Vincent Cox Executors of this my last Will and  
Testament, revoking all other former Wills by me made, In Witness whereof  
I have hereunto set my hand and Seal the 5<sup>th</sup> day of July 1698  
Sealed & Published according to law in presence of Vincent Cox  
of us Henry Rose, Robert Bennett, Mary Bennett  
Westmoreland Co<sup>t</sup> At a Court held for the said County the 16<sup>th</sup> day of October 1698

This Indenture made the 13<sup>th</sup> day of November Anno Dom 1698 Between  
Robert Foster of Westmoreland County of the one part and Thomas Hobson of  
Washington Parish on the said County (Planter) of the other part, Whereas he before  
the Proprietors of the northern neck of Virginia as by Deed or Patent under  
the hand of their Agents and Seal of Office bearing Date the 11<sup>th</sup> day of August  
1691. Did convey make over and Assign unto Robert Foster aforesaid, a  
Culam Tract of land + + +
