this 17th day of May Anno Dom 1698. The Condition of this Obligation is
such that if the above bound, William Peirce his heirs Executors & Assigns

shall from time to time and at all times hereafter, Observe perform, fulfill and
Keep all & every the Articles & Clauses made and intended in a certain Deed Sale
of Land, being the One Moiety of Twelve Hundred Acres of Land, the which on his
and their parts, they ought to doe that thin this Obligation to be Void and of none
Effect, otherwise to be and remain in full force power and Virtue.
