Name and place all and Singular thing and things whatsoeuer that shall be
expeditious and necessary concerning the Premises as thoroughly, wholly & surely as
myself should do if myself were there in Person, Ratifying & Confirming by these
Present whatsoever my said Attorney shall do or suffer to be done in or about the



being in perfect health of body, mind and memory, but knowing the certainty of death
and the uncertainty of life do make and ordain this my last Will & Testament
in manner and form following. In premises I bequeath my Soul to God that
gave it, hoping through the merits of Jesus Christ my beloved Saviour to attain

to receive free Pardon and remission of all my sins and my body to the Earth
from whence it came to be decently buried at the discretion of my Executors hereafter
named. Item I give and bequeath unto Elizabeth Parker and Ruth Parker
Daughters of William Parker all my Land joining to John Middleton, from
the Swamp on the backside of my dwelling Plantation, containing by estimation
300 Acres, less it more or less, the said Elizabeth and Ruth Parker & their heirs
to be equally divided between them, the said John Middleton having free
privileges of his Tann fats which he now hath on the said Lands during his life
without any molestation of them or any by or for them: Item I give & bequeath
unto William Sandman Son of John Sandman and his heirs forever 100 Acres
of Land, joining to the Land of Robert Middleton, beginning at his the said Robt
Middletons Spring and so to run to the extent of the lines of Freshwater & Kule
Item all the rest of my Land I give unto Edward & Minty & William Short and
their heirs forever to be equally divided between them the said Minty, to have
in his part my now dwelling Plantation, the whole bequest of Land in this
my Will being 840 Acres. Item my Will is that the said Edward Minty bee
under the care and tuition of the aforesaid William Parker until he arrives to
the age of 17 years and until the said Minty shall arrive to the age of 21
years my Will is the said William Parker shall have the management and
looking after his said Plantation, as the said Minty having liberty to work
or plant on his said Land, when arrived to the age of 17 years ^{old}, the said
William Parker giving him two years Schooling: Lastly all the Rest of
my ~~Estate~~ goods and chattels whatsoever I give and bequeath unto William
Parker, whom I make my full and sole Executor of this my last Will and
Testament, ~~be~~ paying all my Debts and seeing this my Will performed and it is

take and receive the same and ship home to the said Mr. Hicks 5000 pounds

Security to Inform the Will of the Testator
