testament in manner and form following hereby revoking all former wills
written or unwritten by me made dated the twenty third of October 1701
In witness I bequeath my soule to God that gave it mee hoping by the
merits of my saviour Jesus Christ it shall bee reunited to my body at
the last day and be glorified and my body I will & be decently bury-
ed at the discretion of my Executors and Executors hereafter named. Item
I will that all my just debts bee justly bee paid Item I will and
bequeath all the remainder part of my Estate after my just debts being
paid to my loving wife Eliz^a Buckley except as hereafter excepted.
Item I give and bequeath my son John Buckley untill he bee one & twenty
years of age unto Thomas Thompson to stay and remain with him to
that age Item I will and bequeath unto my loving son John Buck-
ley one son short to be delivered after my decease Item I make and
appoint my loving wife Eliz^a and Thomas Thompson my Ex^{rs} of this
my last will and testament to my whole & sole Ex^{rs} Hear of this
my last will and testament.
