In the name of God Amen, I Edward Halsey being very sick and weak, but thanks be unto God yet of perfect sense & memory calling to mind the uncertainty of life and knowing he appointed once for all men to die and in hopes at the last day to rise again and have everlasting life. I do give and bequeath unto John Halsey my son one gun and one iron pott about four gallons and a iron pottle and two pewter dishes - and three plates and one flock bed & furniture and one cow and a calf and I do give him a man colt aged about a half a year old, with all her increase except the first male foale that she or her dam brings which I do give unto my daughter Elizabeth Halsey - and I do give my son a poplar chest about four foot long and I do leave him at age at sixteen years old to go where he will and receive what he has - I do give unto my daughter Eliz^a Halsey two pewter dishes and three plates and a iron pott

about four gallons and I do lean her a cow and a calf aged about 4 years old, and I do lean my wife whole Est^e of my whole Estate, except what I lean unto my children, my daughter Elizabeth Haly is four years the 11th day of August in the year 1703, my son John Haly is a year old the 19th day of December in the year 1702.
