come - We Henry Ashton and Eliz^a Ashton wife of the aforesaid Henry
Ashton both of Romish in Corley parish in Westmoreland County within the Colony
of Virg^a sends greeting in our Lord God everlasting. Now know ye that
we Henry and Eliza Ashton for the reate love and affection which we
have upto William Sturman son of John Sturman of the County and
parish abovesaid have freely given, granted, enfeoffed and confirmed
and do by these presents doe give, grant, enfeoff, alien and confirm
unto him the said William Sturman & his heirs lawfully begotten
by his body a certaine tract or parcell of land containing one hun-
dred and thirty three acres being part of a greater dividend of land
containing one thousand and four acres granted unto Mr. Richard
Sturman 1666 by patent bearing date the twentyeth day of October 1666
and by the said Sturman devised unto his son Richard Sturman junior
by his last will and testament and by the last will and testament
of Rich^r Sturman jun^r devised unto Eliz^a Hardidge daughter of Wm Hardidge
Court die^r and since the said Eliz^a Hardidge daughter of William Har-
didge hath intermaried with the aforesaid Henry Ashton see that it is
become the right of inheritance of them both all excepting one hundred
acres of land devised unto the aforesaid John Sturman out of the afores-
