To all Xpian People and others to whom these presents shall come - We Henry Ashton and Eliz^a Ashton wife of the aforesaid Henry both of Somerby in Corley parish in Westmoreland County within the County of York^{sh} sends greeting in our Lord God everlasting. Now know ye that we Henry and Eliz^a Ashton for the real love and affection which we bear unto William Sturman son of John Sturman of the County and parish aforesaid have freely given, granted, infeoffed and confirmed and do by these presents do give, grant, infeoff, alien and confirm unto him the said William Sturman & his heirs lawfully begotten by his body a certain tract or parcel of land containing one hundred and thirty three acres being part of a greater dividend of land containing one thousand and four acres granted unto Mr. Richard Sturman dec^d by patent bearing date the twentieth day of October 1666 and by the said Sturman devised unto his son Richard Sturman jun^r by his last will and testament and by the last will and testament of Rich^d Sturman jun^r devised unto Eliz^a Hardidge daughter of W^m Hardidge gent^l dec^d and since the said Eliz^a Hardidge daughter of W^m Hardidge hath intermarried with the aforesaid Henry Ashton so that it is become the right of Inheritance of them both all excepting one hundred acres of land devised unto the aforesaid John Sturman out of the aforesaid
