Item, I give unto my son Jordan Weedon all my Lands in Westmard County to him and his heirs of his body, lawfully begotten of his body forever, but in default of such heirs, I give it to my daughter Mary Weedon to her and the male heirs of her body lawfully begotten forever, but in default of such heirs then I give it to George Weedon son of Thomas Weedon and George Weedon son of Benj^d Weedon equally to be divided between them to them and their heirs forever. Item I give all my personal Estate to be equally divided between my loving wife Susannah and my two children Jordan Weedon and Mary Weedon. Item, I give to Benj^d Weedon my best suite of death shew, stockings and hat. Item I give to George Beard my next best suit of cloth. Item I give to Thomas Weedon my ring the Cape being in memory of In^d Jordan, Item, I give to John Weedon one ring mark L.W. I do hereby constituting and appointing my loving wife Susannah and my son Jordan Weedon and my loving Brother John Weedon my whole and sole Executors. I do leave the care and tuition of my two children Jordan Weedon and Mary Weedon and their Estates to John Weedon and to live on the plantation with them and to maintain them out of the profits of the said Estate and it is my will that my Estate shall not be appraised but an Inventory be taken and returned to the Court, and I do appoint Andrew Munroe and John Washington and Thomas Weedon to divide my Estate. This Indenture made the two and twentieth day of March in the second year of the reign of our sovereign Lady Anne by the Grace of God of England, Scotland, France & Ireland Queen Defender of the faith, and in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and three, Between John Spence, of Popple parish in the County of Westmore, Gent^e of the one party and Isaac Sheppard of Washington parish in the County aforesaid planter of the other party — Witnesseth that the said John Spence, for and in consideration of the sum of five hundred and thirty pounds of true and lawful money of England to him in hand paid by the said Isaac Sheppard at and before the executing and delivery of these presents, the receipt whereof he doth hereby acknowledge, hath bargained and sold and by these presents doth bargain and sell unto the said Isaac Sheppard all his right, title, benefit, property, claim and demand whatsoever of, in and to all and singular, eighty acres of land by estimation, be it more or less, being part of a patent granted to the said John Spence partly to these presents by Phillip Ludwell Esq. then agent for the proprietors of the Northern Neck of Virginia, the aforesaid patent bearing date the 13th day December 1690 and being for eight hundred and twenty acres in the said patent mentioned, the said tract or parcel of land situate, lying and being in the parish of Wash-
