John Spencer for and in consideration of the sum of fift
ling^s of tme and lawfull money of England to him on hand
paid by the said Isaac Sheppard at and before the ensaing
and delivery of these presents, the receipt whereof he doth
hereby acknowledge hath bargained and sold and by these
present to both bargain and sell unto the said Isaac Sheppard
all his right, title, benefit, property, claim and demands what
soever of, in and to all and singular, eighty acres of land
by estimation, be it more or less, being part of a patent gran
ted to the said John Spencer party to these presents by
Phillip Ludwell Esq^r then agent for the proprietors of the No
thern Neck of Virginia, the aforesaid patent bearing date the
12th day December 1690 and being for eight hundred and twenty
acres in the said patent mentioned, the said tract or par
