

Isaac Allerton  
his will

In the name of God amen! the 25<sup>th</sup> day of October in the first  
 year of the reign of our most gracious Sovereign Lady Ann, by the grace of  
 God &c. Anno Domini 1702 - I, Isaac Allerton of the County of Westmoreland  
 in the Colony of Virg<sup>a</sup> Eng<sup>a</sup> being sick and weak of body, but of sound and  
 perfect memory thanks be to Almighty God for the same, do make this my  
 last will and Testament in manner and form following revoking and absolutely  
 annulling by these presents all and every Will and Wills, Testament and  
 Testaments heretofore by me made or declared either by word or by writing  
 and this only to be taken for my last will and Testament and none other -  
 Imprimis - I give my soul to God who gave it and my body to the Earth  
 from whence it came to be buried in such decent and Christian manner  
 as to my Executors hereafter named shall be thought meet and convenient  
 thus to remain till the joyful resurrection trusting through the merits,  
 death and passion of my Saviour Jesus Christ to have full and free pardon  
 for all my sins and to inherit everlasting life - And as touching the dis-  
 position of all such temporal Estate as it hath pleased Almighty God to  
 bestow upon me, I do order, give and dispose thereof in manner & form  
 following (My) Item - I give and bequeath the sum of ten pounds sterling  
 to the Church of fofle parish to be disposed of by my Executor hereafter  
 named for ornaments for the said Church - Item - I will that all my  
 just debts be paid duly and punctually - Item - I give, bequeath and  
 devise to my dear daughter Sarah Lee and my grandson Allerton Newton  
 two tracts of land lying and being in the County of Stafford (My) One  
 tract of one thousand and fifty acres and the other tract of six hundred  
 acres to be equally divided between them - to have and to hold the said  
 two tracts of land to them the said Sarah Lee and Allerton Newton and  
 the heirs of their bodies lawfully begotten to be equally divided betwixt  
 them as is aforesaid. Item - I give, bequeath and devise to my dear dau-  
 ghter Elizabeth Starr all Heirs who live in New England six hundred acres  
 of land part of a dividend of one and twenty hundred and fifty acres  
 lying and being on South side of Rappahannock River, to her the said  
 Elizabeth and such of her children as she shall dispose of the same to, but  
 in case the said Elizabeth be dead before the date of this my will, I will &  
 devise the said six hundred acres of land to her eldest son and to her heirs  
 forever. Item - I give and bequeath to my son Isaac Allerton the

Sarah Lee the son of John Thomas wife of Isaac Allerton  
 to have to her and her heirs the sum of ten pounds  
 sterling my said son Isaac Allerton to give to my  
 said daughter

named for ornament for the said Church - Item - I will that all my  
just debts be paid duly and punctually - Item - I give, bequeath and  
devise to my dear daughter Sarah Lee and my grandson Allerton Newton  
two tracts of land lying and being in the County of Stafford (viz) One  
tract of One thousand and fifty acres and the other tract of six hundred  
acres to be equally divided between them - to have and to hold the said  
two tracts of land to them the said Sarah Lee and Allerton Newton and  
the heirs of their bodies lawfully begotten to be equally divided between  
them as is aforesaid. Item - I give, bequeath and devise to my dear daugh-  
ter Elizabeth Starr all Heirs who live in New England six hundred acres  
of land part of a dividend of one and twenty hundred and fifty acres  
lying and being on South side of Rappahannock River, to her the said  
Elizabeth and such of her children as she shall dispose of the same to, but  
in case the said Elizabeth be dead before the date of this my will, I will &  
devise the said six hundred acres of land to her eldest son and to his heirs  
forever. Item - I give and bequeath to my said daughter Eliza Heirs the  
sum of two thousand pounds of tobacco to be paid upon demand - And  
for as much as ~~much~~ my daughter Frances has <sup>had</sup> a sufficient part or  
proportion of my estate given her in consideration of marriage, I do  
therefor for memorial sake give unto her three daughters Elizabeth,  
Rebecca and Minifred Francis the sum of one thousand pounds of tobacco  
a piece to be paid them at the years of twenty or the day of marriage  
which shall first happen - Item - I give and bequeath to my grandson  
Allerton Newton the sum of one thousand pounds of tobacco to be paid  
at the years of one and twenty. Item - I do publish and declare my  
intent and meaning that the abov legacies given to my <sup>d</sup> daughters,  
grandson and granddaughters be deemed and taken to be in full and  
full satisfaction of their filial portions or child's parts of my Estate.  
Item - I give, bequeath and devise all the remaining part of my lands  
& tenements not abov bequeathed her or wheresoever situate and being  
to my well beloved son Willoughby Allerton and to his heirs forever.

Lastly - I make, ordain constitute and appoint my said son

Willingby Allerton Executor of this my last will and testament to whom I do give and bequeath all my personal Estate, goods & chattels real and personal of what kind, sort or quality ever, the same be. And in witness that this is my last will and testament I have hereunto set my hand and seal the day and year first above written. Indenture to  
Ransdale

This Indenture made this seventh day of December in the year of our Lord God One thousand seven hundred and in the twelfth year of the reign of our Sovereign Lord King William by the grace of God King of England, Scotland, France & Ireland &c And between Abraham Echell of the one part and Edward Ransdale of the other part - Witnesseth that the said Echell doth covenant and agree to and with the said Edward Ransdale to bind himself an apprentice to the said Ransdale for the full space and term of six years to learn the perfect trades and occupation of Carpenter, Cooper and joiner as far forth as he the said Ransdale can instruct and teach him and doth bind himself by these presents that he will not intermarry nor contract himself with any woman during the
