Lord 1762. I Nathaniel Garland of the parish of Copke in the County
of Westmoreland being sick and weak of body but of perfect and sound mind
and memory do make, ordain, ~~constitute~~ this my last will and testament
in manner and form following - Imp^t I give my soul to God the
donor in hopes of pardon and forgiveness of all my sins through the merits
of my Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ and my body to be decently bur-
ied at the discretion of Executors hereafter named. 2^{dly} That whereas
Robert Middleton and Mary his wife did in their life time give to my
son John and my son Nathaniel to each one man, and whereas my
said sons are both de^d and before and since their deaths I having
and made use of the increase of the said manes to the value of six
thousand pounds of tobacco my will and desire is that my son Jeremiah
Garland may have the aforesaid sum of six thousand pounds of tobacco
paid him out of my Estate which of right to him belongs immediately after
my decease as sales one servant named Teague Rogan which was
the proper servant of my son Nathaniel Garland deceased

and also one still tub and worm which was sent out of England for the proper use and rescue of my son John Garland deceased, which said servant still tub and worm I desire may be delivered to my son Jeremiah immediately after my decease and not to be esteemed as any of my Estate. Item my will and desire is that my son Jeremiah have two corns which were formerly given by me to his two deceased brothers which two corns are at this time unmarked and also one small gun that was my son John Garland's I desire may be delivered to my son Jeremiah and not to be deemed as my Estate. Item I give all my whole Estate of what nature or kind soever to my son Jeremiah Garland to him and his heirs forever and do make him my said son whole and sole Executor of this my last will and testament but because my said son is under age I do hereby appoint my loving brother Thomas Garland trustee to my said son and his Estate until he my said son shall arrive to his full age to take upon him the Executorship of this my last will and testament.
