I do ordain this my last will and testament, in manner and form as follows. First I give my soul to God that gave it me and my body to be decently buried according to the direction of my Executors hereafter. After all my just debts paid I dispose of all worldly estate that God hath bestowed upon me in manner as follows.

I Item. I give unto my eldest daughter Mary my plantation that I call little Dick with the land belonging to it that is to say all of that side of a deep branch that parts the plantation I live of and that to her & her heirs forever, and if she should die without issue that then to fall to my son Cosecomb, and his heirs forever. I give my daughter also four head of cattle to her and her heirs forever. Item. I give unto my daughter Margrett four head of cattle, two cows, two heifers of three years old. I give her also my penter dishes six plates, one iron pot, one feather bed, one rug, one pair new blankets, one pair of sheets, one iron and pipe. I give my daughter Margrett my plantation in Stafford forest and all the land belonging to it to her and her heirs forever if she should die without issue lawfully begotten of her own body that then to fall to my son Cosecomb and his heirs forever. I give my daughter Margrett one young gray mare and all her increase forever. Item. I give unto thy son in law Christopher one gray mare and given to him and his heirs forever. Item. I give all
