In the name of God amen! I Robert Legg being sick in body but
in sound and perfect memory, blessed be God for the same and
knowing the uncertainty of this life do make this my last will
and testament in manner, and form as followeth, first, I give
my soul to God in sure and certain hope to have the pardon
of all my sins - Next. I do annul and make void all wills
formerly made by me either by word or writing and my will is
that this be taken for my last will and testament and no
other, - Imp^t I shew. I give all my Estate to my beloved wife
Mary, I shew, I give my son James Legg to my wife till he arriv
to the age of eighteen years. I shew, I give my daughter Eliza
Legg to my wife till she shall arriv to the age of sixteen
years. I shew. I do make my wife my sole executrix of this my
will and testament. I shew, I give the first foals of my
mare brings, be it horse or mare, to my son James Legg.
Witness my hand this 12th of Feby. 1700.
