his will

In the name of God amen! the 31<sup>st</sup> day of January 1703 in the  
first year of the reign of our Sovereign Lady Queen Anne of England &  
I Stephen Jones of the parish of Sople in the County of Westmorland  
Bry<sup>a</sup> gent<sup>b</sup> being sick and weak in body but of sound and perfect mem-  
ory (thanks be to the Almighty God for the same) and calling to mind  
the uncertain state of this mortall life and that all flesh must  
yield unto death when it shall please God to call - And being  
desirous to put things in order do make this my last will and  
testament in manner and form following revoking and abolidgely an-  
nulling by these presents all and every testament and testaments  
will and wills heretofore by me made and declared either by words  
or writing notwithstanding any promises to the contrary or clause where-

buy in the same and this only to be taken for my last will and testament.  
First I bequeath my soul to Almighty God my maker and dear friend  
my redeemer and to the holy Ghost my sanctifier and my body to the earth  
from whence it came to be buried in such Christian maner as my Executor  
shall think fit there to rest till the soul and body shall meet again and  
be joyned together at the joyful resurrection which God hath promised.  
Through the merits of Jesus Christ upon our true reparation and touching  
such temporal Estate of gods and cattle as it hath pleased Almighty God for  
beyond my deserts to bestow upon me I do order, dispose and bequeath the  
same in manner and form following. Imp<sup>r</sup> I give and bequeath unto  
Madam Lettie Lee wife to the Honble Richard Lee Esq<sup>r</sup> one silver fruit dish  
one silver tumbler and two silver spoons and one piece of stuff - Item - I  
give unto Richard Osborne for making this my last will & one piece of  
holland - Item - I give unto Paul Horrell for his care of me in my us-  
hers one hogshead of tobacco and a piece of iron like a juttle at Mr Thomas  
Tanner. And for the performance of this my last will and testament  
I do make Richard Osborne and Paul Horrell my lawful Executors to look  
after and receive and pay all my debts. In witness whereof I have here-  
unto set my hand and seal the day and year above said.
