hand received and wherewith I acknowledge myself fully satisfied &  
contented and paid han bargained, sold, given, granted, aliened enfeoffed  
and confirmed and by these presents do bargain, sell, give, grant,  
alien, enfeoff and confirm unto John Ware of the County aforesaid a  
certain tract or parcel of land containing two hundred and fifty
