In the name of God Amen! I, Thomas Atwell of the parish of Copple  
in the County of Westmoreland, Gent<sup>r</sup> being of good, sound and perfect memory  
and considering the uncertainty of this life and certainty of my departure  
out of it, do make, constitute, ordain and appoint this my last will and  
testament in manner and form following (viz<sup>t</sup>) First, I give my soul into the  
hands of Almighty God, hoping by the mediation of my blessed savior Jesus  
Christ, to receive it again at the resurrection of the dead, my body I  
give to the Earth to be decently buried. And for my worldly goods I dis-  
pose, will and bequeath as followeth. Item. I give and bequeath unto  
my loving brother Francis Atwell my best feather bed, bolster & furniture there-  
unto belonging to him and his heirs forever. Item. I give and bequeath unto  
my loving brother John Atwell my best riding horse, with bridle & saddle  
 pistols, holsters & furniture thereto belonging, my sword and belt and  
cane with all my wearing apparel of what kind soever as hats & other  
things unto him his heirs & assigns forever. Item. all the rest of my  
estate, real and personal as lands and household stuff, cattle, cheep  
horses, mares, hogs and what ever else I am now possessed of give and  
bequeath unto my son Francis Atwell and to his heirs forever, And it is  
my will and desire that my said loving brother Francis Atwell doth im-  
mediately after my decease take my said son Francis Atwell, into his  
care, custody and tuition until he attains to the age of sixteen years  
together with my said Estate real and personal by this my last will  
to him bequeathed, to be disposed of to the best advantage, use, profit,  
advantage and interest, of my said son during his minority and yearly  
and every year, render an account of the profits and loss thereof be-  
fore the worshipful her Majesties Justices of the peace for the time  
being, at the Court held every year for the said County of Westmoreland  
either at December or January Court, and if it should so happen that  
there should arise any sum or sums of tobacco more than for the con-  
venient education of my said son during his minority, that then it  
is my will that the said sums of tobacco shall be laid out & disposed  
of to purchase land or rents against my said son comes to the age  
of sixteen, he being of the age of five years the eleventh day of June  
hence next following after the date hereof. It is my will and desire

he should be carefully and constantly kept to schooling and teaching  
 after my decease until he attains to the age of twelve years and it is my  
 will that if my said son Francis Atwell happens to die before he at-  
 tains to the age of sixteen years. I will and bequeath all my Estate real  
 and personal given to my said son Francis Atwell unto Thomas Atwell son  
 of said brother John Atwell when he shall attain to the age of one and  
 twenty years, and if it should happen that the said Thomas Atwell son  
 of the said John Atwell should die before he attains to the age of one  
 and twenty years, then it is my will and I give and bequeath all  
 my said Estate unto Ann Eye daughter of John Eye deceased Francis  
 and Hannah Tanner, daughters of Mary + Thomas Tanner, to be  
 equally divided between them, and the survivors of them and to  
 their heirs forever, and do make, constitute, ordain and appoint  
 my said living brother Francis Atwell whole and sole Executor of  
 this my last will and testament. In witness whereof I  
 have hereunto set my hand and seal the thirteenth day of  
 March 1702.
