This Indenture made the three and twentieth day of April in the fourth year of the reign of our Sovereign Lady Queen by the grace of God of England, Scotland, France and Ireland Queen defender of the faith &c and in the year of our Lord God one thousand seven hundred and six Between John Butler of the parish of St. Anne in the County of Essex within the Colony of Virg^a plant^r nephew and heir apparent of W^m Butler late of Appomattox in the County of Westmoreland within the same Colony Clerk dec^r of the one part and John Elliott of the parish of Washington in the County of Westmoreland and Colony of Virg^a aforesaid Gent^r of the other part. Whereas the said John Butler at the time of the sealing and delivery of these presents is and standeth lawfully seized in his demesne as of fa, of, in and to all that tract of land containing by estimation three hundred and eighty acres (be the same more or less) situate, lying and being on the South East side of Appomattox Creek in the County of Westmoreland aforesaid being part of four hundred and twenty acres of land formerly bargained and sold in fee unto the said W^m Butler dec^r by Charles Baldwin also dec^r by one deed Poll under his hand and seal bearing date the fifth day of June one thousand six hundred seventy and nine the latter forty years the remainder thereof being conveyed in fee unto the said John Elliott by Jane Butler Relict and Executrix of the said W^m Butler dec^r by one deed Poll under her hand and seal bearing date the four and twentieth day of April one thousand six hundred eighty and three in performance of one bond under the hand and seal of the said W^m Butler.
