After all my just debts paid I dispose of all my worldly estate that God hath bestowed upon me in manner as follows. Item - I give unto my eldest daughter Mary my plantation that I call little Dicks with the land belonging to it that is to say all of that side of a deep branch that parts the plantation I live of, and that to her & her heirs forever, and if she should die without issue that then to fall to my son Forcomb, and his heirs forever. I give my daughter also four head of cattle to her and her heirs forever. Item - I give unto my daughter Margrett four head of cattle, two cows, two heifers of three year old. I give her also two better dishes, six plates, one iron pot, one feather bed, one rug, one pair new blankets, one pair of sheets, one son and pig. I give my daughter Margrett my plantation in Stafford forest and all the land belonging to it to her and her heirs forever. If she should die without issue lawfully begotten of her own body that then to fall to my son Forcomb and his heirs forever. I give my daughter Margaret one young gray mare and all her increase forever. Item - I give unto my son in law Christopher one gray mare and purre to him and his heirs forever. Item - I give all

I have not given away to my daughter, to my son Coscomb Bennet and
his heirs forever, and if my son should die without issue lawfully be-
gotten of his own body that then all my lands to fall to my two daughters
and their heirs forever and if they all should die that then all my lands
to fall to my two sons in law John & Thomas Christopher to them and their
heirs forever. Item - I give my son forscorn all the rest of my estate pre-
sent at that I now enjoy, and I do make my son my whole and sole exe-
cutor to fulfill this my last will and testament. I likewise make my
son at age at the hour of my death. I do constitute and ordain my friend
Daniel Field my trustee for the good of my son to advise and instruct
him

him in the management of his estate, that he doth not make away with it,
