presents all and every testament and Testaments, Will & Wills heretofore  
by me declared either by word or by writing, notwithstanding any pro-  
mise to the contrary or cause derogatory in same and this to be taken  
only for my last will and testament and none other, first I bequeath my  
soul to almighty God my maker and my body to the Earth from whence  
it came to be buried in such decent and Christian manner as to my Exe<sup>c</sup>  
shall be thought meet and convenient there to rest until my soul & body  
shall meet again at the joyful resurrection and to be made partakers of  
the never fading joys of immortality and touching such temporal Estate  
of goods, Chattels & debts as the Lord hath been pleased to bestow upon me  
far above my deserts, I do order, give and bequeath and dispose the same  
in manner and form following - Item - I do give and bequeath to my  
living wife Elizabeth my bed feather bed and furniture, and I give my  
said wife, one of the best iron pots in my house and the best brass kettle  
Item - I give and bequeath unto my loving wife Eliz<sup>a</sup> all that tract of  
land which I bought of Maj<sup>r</sup> Hauke Wright containing two hundred  
acres - to have and to hold the said land during my wifes life and  
after my said wifes decease I do give and bequeath the said two hun-  
dred acres of land to Mary Abingdon daughter of Law: Abingdon late  
of this County dec<sup>t</sup> to her and her heirs forever - Item - I give & bequeath  
unto my good friend Alex<sup>m</sup> Webster one large gold ring and silver box  
Item - I give unto Amy Webster wife of Alexander Webster three crown pie-  
ces containing four shillings sterling each crown, Item - I give unto  
Sarah Benyman wife of Jas<sup>t</sup> Benyman three half crown pieces

brought of John Wheeler - Lastly - I make, ordain and appoint my  
sister in law Sarah Blaydon daughter of John Blaydon late of this  
County deceased my sole Executor of this my last will and testament  
to whom I bequeath all the remainders of my goods, chattels,  
moveables and immovables, after the satisfaction of my debts and  
payment of the legacies abovesigned by me bequeathed and let it my will  
and desire that my good friend Mr. Webster be trustee & overseer  
of my whole Estate with my Executor above mentioned, and it  
is my will and desire that my said Exec<sup>r</sup> shall not act or do anything  
as to disposing, selling or making away any of my Estate without  
the advice and consent of my trustee Mr. Webster. In witness  
whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal the day 5 year  
first above written.
