his children have given and granted and do by these presents give and
grant and make over to my loving son John Hydon all that piece or
parcel of land he is now located on, situate, lying and being in the said
County and parish being formerly surveyed and laid out for one hundred
and fifty acres with all houses, outhouses, orchards, fences and timber, timber
trees, woods, waters and water courses, mines, minerals, and appurtenances
whatsoever, Beginning for the said land at a white standing on the South
side of a swamp called digwood swamp which tree divideth this
land and the land formerly sold by my former husband James Camp-
bell dec^d and myself to my son in law Nathaniel Pope as will appear
in a deed of sale recorded in the County Court records of Westmoreland
