In the name of God Amen! April the twenty second  
Aunon 1708. I John Hudson of the County of Westmore  
sick and weak in body but in perfect sense and  
with my thanks be given to Almighty God for it and calling  
to mind the uncertain state of man and knowing that  
it is appointed unto all men once to die I do ordain  
this my last will and testament in manner and form as  
follows. I give and bequeath my soul unto  
the hands of Almighty God that gave it me and my  
body I recommend to the Earth from whence it was  
taken to be decently buried according to the discretion of  
my Executors hereafter named and touching my worldly  
estate that it hath pleased God to bestow me in this  
life I give and bestow in manner and form as follows  
Item I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Margery  
the plantation whereon I now live and all the land belon-  
ging to it to her and her heirs forever. Item I give  
and bequeath unto my daughter Mary the planta-  
tion whereon Edward Manning now lives on with all the  
lands belonging to it to her and her heirs forever. Item  
I give and bequeath unto my two daughters all my whole  
estate, movable and immovable to be equally divided be-  
tween them when they shall arrive to the age of sixteen  
or married. Item I constitute and appoint my loving uncle  
William Rush and my loving brother Joshua Hudson my  
Execors to fulfill this my last will and testament and  
after my death that my uncle Rush have my daughter  
Mary

Mary and her part of the Estate and my brother Joshua my daughter and her part of the Estate and them my said children to keep and bring up in the fear of God until they attain to the age of sixteen or married. As witness my hand and seal the day and year first written.
