I Thomas Brown of Westmorland County and parish of Eosly being my sick and weak in body but of sound and perfect memory do make and ordain this my last will and testament March the 14th day 1706 first I give and bequeath my soul to Almighty God that gave it me and my body to the Earth to be decently buried according to the direction of my Executors hereafter named and the Estate that it hath pleased God to bestow upon me I give and bequeath in manner and form following My will is that my whole Estate immediately after my decease be brought to an Appraisement and after my just debts be paid my whole Estate to be equally divided between my wife Elizabeth Brown and my Daughter Francis Brown & my son George Brown and my son Thomas Brown further I make and ordain my Elizabeth Brown my brother George Brown my brother William Brown together my whole Executors and my will is that if my aforesaid brothers George and William Brown shall see or think fit to take my aforesaid children and their Estates into their own Custody as witness my hand and seal the day and year above written:

Seas of Anno One thousand seven hundred and seven in the fifth year
of the reign of our sovereign Lady Ann by the Grace of God
of England, Scotland, France and Ireland Queen, Defender
of the faith Betwixt Richard Watts of Washington parish
in Westmoreland County in Virginia Gentleman of the one
part, and Abraham Blagge of the same parish and county
planter of the other part, Witnesseth that the said Richard
Watts for and in consideration of five shillings of lawful
money of England in hand paid by Abraham Blagge afore-
said at and before the sealing and delivery of these
presents the receipt whereof he doth hereby acknowledge
and of every part and parcel thereof doth acquit and
discharge the said Abraham Blagge hath bargained
and sold and do by these presents bargain, sell and
make over unto to the said Abraham Blagge all
his right, title benefit, property claim and demand
whatsoever of, in and to one thousand and fifty acres
of land situate, lying and being in the County of West-
moreland and Washington Parish the aforesaid thousand
and fifty acres of land formerly granted to Nathaniel
Pope etc by patent bearing date the thirteenth day of
January 1661 and in the thirteenth year of the
reign of King Charles the second &c and by the said
