This Indenture made the seventeenth day of May 1767 and in the sixth year of the reign of our Sovereign Lady (now by the Grace of God of England, Scotland, France and Ireland Queen Defender, of the faith &c) Between Thomas Taylor of Washington Parish in Westmoreland County cordwainer, & Elizabeth his wife of the one part, and Andrew Munroe of the parish and County before^d West^d of the other part. Witnesseth that the said Thomas Taylor, and Elizabeth his wife for and in consideration of ten thousand pounds of good tobacco, to have and deliver by the said Andrew Munroe at and before the executing and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof the said Thomas Taylor, and Elizabeth his wife do or have and thereunto fully satisfied, contented and paid and thereof and every
