



Osborn & Edmund Owen of Copple Parish in the County of Westmorland planters are held & firmly bound unto James Byard of the same place in the full & just sume of thirty thousand pounds of good sound merchantable Tobacco and Cask to be paid to the said James Byard his heires executors or assignes to the which payment well & truly to be made and performed we bind our selves our and either of our heires executors and adm'rs joynly & severally firmly by these presents sealed with our seals dated this 22^d day of Feby Anno Domini 1713.

The Condition of the above obligation is such that if the above bounden John Owen Thomas Osborn & Edmund Owen their & every of their heires executors and adm'rs and either of them do & shall from time to time and at all times forever hereafter observe & perform full-fie & keep all & singular the covenants articles grants & proviso's comprised & mentioned in a certaine Indenture of Sale made by the said John Owen to him the said James Byard his heires & assignes forever which said Deed bears equal date with these presents then this obligation to be utterly void & of none effect otherwise to stand be & remaine in full force power & virtue

In the name of God amen I Andrew Munro of Washington Parish in the County of Westmorland gent: being sick of body but of perfect sense & memory thanks to almighty God for the same do make & ordain this to be my last will & testament in manner & form following After I surrender my soul into the hands of God that gave it and my body to the earth to be buried in decent manner at the discretion of my executors hereafter mentioned and as for the worldly estate which God has been pleased to bestow on me I give and bequeath as followeth In p'to I give & bequeath unto my

son Spence Munrod my Plantation wheron I now live to begin at the spring
 branch on the upper side of my orchard and to run from thence a straight
 course to the road that leads over the head of the Creek to my brother Willi-
 am Munroes and so along the said road. I to the head of the said Creek
 with all my land on the South side of the said road line & branch to him
 & the heirs of his body lawfully begotten for ever and for want of such
 heirs to my son Andrew Munrod and his heirs lawfully begotten of
 his body for ever and for want of such heirs to my daughter Susanna
 & the heirs lawfully begotten of her body for ever and for want of such
 heirs to the next heir at law. Item I give unto my son Andrew
 Munrod all the remaining part of my land lying on the North side
 of the S^t. branch line and road between them & the Creek to him & the
 heirs lawfully begotten of his body for ever and for want of such
 heirs to my son Spence Munrod and the heirs of his body lawfully
 begotten for ever and for want of such heirs I give the said land to
 Andrew Munrod son to my brother William Munrod and his heirs
 lawfully begotten for ever and for want of such to the next heir at law
 Item it is my will that my two sons shall have liberty to sell timber
 on any part of my land for building houses on the land they possess
 by this Will during their lives. Item it is my will that all the cost
 of my estate my exec^{rs} build on my son Andrew part of land a forty
 foot Tobaceo house & dwelling house twenty four foot long eigh-
 teen foot wide plank it about & below and what else what else my
 exec^{rs} think fit to bestow thereon both in the adding or finishing
 the said house Item I give unto my son Spence Munrod a negroe
 woman named Nell which said Negroe was given him by his grand
 mother Jordan a young black unbroke horse my silver hilt sword
 my arum & a gold ring which was his mothers the place is this (In the
 I find content of mind) Item I give unto my son Andrew Munrod
 a negroe woman named Betty which negroe was given by his mother
 and a sorrell horse he calls his. Item I give unto my daughter Eliza
 with Arington a feather bed in her possession I lent it her when her
 house was burnt I also gave her five thousand pounds of Tobacco to be
 paid her a year after my decease Item I give unto my grand son

John Arrington a young Com & her increase. Item I give unto my daughter Susanna Munrod one Negroe boy called Will two Com & two hufers of two or three years old two young shears of two or three years old a good feather bed a bolster two pillows a rugg a pair of blankets a pair of sheets & a pair of Curtains & valans all of them new I likewise give her a iron pottle about five or six gallons two penter dishes a young gray mare branded on the buttocks with F rong and domwards) and ten thousand pounds of Tobaccos to be paid out of my estate by my executo: at her lawfull age or day of marriage Item I give unto my wife Sarah Munrod my horse bay Jockey her saddle & bridle the feather bed & bolster I now lie on with a rugg of blankets & sheets the choice of one of my quilts & also the choice of my curtaines & valans Item I give unto my son in law William Elliott my young black mare on the other side Mattox Crucks branded with C and her increase Item I give unto my daughter in law Sarah Elliott one iron grey mare Item I give unto my daughter in law Eliz: Elliott a hufer of three or four years old & her increased Item I give unto my ex: each of them a mourning ring of twenty shillings gold Item I give unto my two sons my nine Negroe which are undisposed of to will Ben Dick Jack Sara Harry Phillip Jeffry James and Nanny and their increase to be equally divided between them when my son Spence shall arrive to the age of eighteen years Item it is my will that my ex: ship on the proper acco: & regal of my two sons ten hhd: of Tobacco at the least this year and what more at any time they shall think fitting and that the money raised by the same to be by my ex: laid out in negroes to be equally divided between my two sons if they have opportunity to purchase them Item I give unto Thomas Mustin my riding Coat & his debt due to me Item I give the remaining part of my estate both here and in England to be equally divided between my two said sons Spence Munrod & Andrew Munrod and it is my Will that my three children Spence Susanna & Andrew Munrod be maintained brought up & educated out of my estate until they are of age by my ex: and that my horses mares black Cattle sheep & hoggs be kept on my plantations and that my ex: keep my

plantations & houses in god's repose and my negroes to work and that
the properties shall be equally divided between my two sons and it is
my will my two sons shall stand to the profit & loss of my estate as
it shall please God to increase or decrease the same during their ma-
jority Item I my will that my two sons shall be of age when they
shall attain to eighteen years to receive their estates but not to bar-
gain sell or any waies dispose of any part thereof until they come to
twenty one years without the consent of my executors Item I make con-
stitution & appoint my trusty friends Richard Walls & Charles Ty-
ler and my loving brother William Munro to be executors of this
my last Will & Testament and doo impower them to dispose of & sell
any of my stock of horses mares black Cattle sheep or hoggs
if they think fit giving an acco^t thereof to the estates of my two
sons for the good of my children and I do hereby revoke all
& make void all other Wills by me formerly made ratifying & con-
firming this to be my last Will and testament In witness whereof
I have hereunto set my hand & seal this 30th day of Oct: 1718

Whereas to day at a Court held for the County the 26th day of May 1714
the last Will & Testament of Andam Munro Gent: executors was presented into
Court by Richard Charles Tyler & William Munro his executors who
made oath thereto and being proved by the oaths of all the
witnesses thereto is admitted to record and upon their
motion certificate is granted them for obtaining a probat
thereof in due form
