This Indenture made the third day of August and in the twelfth year of the reign of our Sovereign Lady Ann by the Grace of God of Great Brittain France & Ireland Queen defender of the faith and in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and thirteen Between John Franklin of this County of Westmore in the Colony of Virg^a planter of the one party and John Popham of the same County & Colony aforesaid Cooper of the other party Witnesseth that the said John Franklin for & in consideration of the sum of five shillings true & lawfull Ducine of Great Brittain to me in hand paid by the said John Popham at & before the enscaling & delivering of these presents the receipt thereof he doth hereby acknowledge He hath bargained & sold and doth by these presents bargain & sell unto the said John Popham all my right title benefit property claims & demands whatsoever of in & unto all & singular one hundred acres of land situated & being in Washington parish in Westmore County and being part of twelve hundred thirty three acres of land granted to Mr John Berryman Mr Wm Horton & John Tanner and by the said Mr Horton was given unto me the said John Franklin as will appear by an Instrument of writing duly acknowledged the County Court of Westmore and is bounded as follows (viz^t) Beginning at a mark'd oak being the northernmost corner tree of four hundred acres of land surveyed for Cap^t Ben^t Berryman out of the afores^d pattern extending along a line of mark trees North 48¹/₂ degrees East 123 pole to the line of the pattern thence along the line South 53¹/₂
