his will

In the name of God amen I Charles Smith of the parish of
Suttonbun & County of Middlesex (Smith) being weak in body but of sound
and perfect memory, bless'd be God for the same, and calling to mind the
uncertainty of this life on earth and knowing that all flesh must
yield unto death when it shall please God to call and being desirous
to settle things in order do make this my last Will & Testament
& hereby revoking & making void all other former Wills & Testaments
whatsoever by me made or caused to be made and publish this for
my last Will & Testament in manner & form following that is
to say first & principally I bequeath my soul into the hands of
almighty God my Creator & redeemer hoping that through the me-
ritorious death and passion of my saviour Jesus Christ I shall
receive free pardon and forgiveness of all my sins and my bo-
dy to the earth from whence it was first taken to be buried
in decent manner at the discretion of my ex^{ors} hereafter
named. And as for such worldly estate & goods which the Lord
in mercy hath endued me with I give & dispose the same in maner
& form following I Sternly give and bequeath unto my son William
Smith and to my daughter Mary Smith all my lands in Norming
with all & singular its appurtenances to them and their lawfull
heires for ever to be divided in manner following that is to say
one hundred acres of the said lands (the dividens thereof to good
crops the whole tract) to the only use benefit & behoof of my said daugh-
ter Mary Smith & to her heires lawfully begotten as aforesaid and
the rest residue & remainder of my lands to my said son William
Smith and to his heires lawfully begotten for ever as aforesaid
again it is my mind & will that if either my son William or
Mary happen to die without lawfull issue that then all the be-
queathed lands afores^d shall become the proper inheritance of the
survivor. But & if they both happen to die (leaving no lawfull
issue behind them) I give & bequeath the s^d lands & premises to my son
Francis Smith and to his heires for ever. I Sternly give and bequeath
unto my son William Smith one of my best feather beds with
all its furniture belonging to it and it is my mind & will that he

shall have his part share of them all I do hereby give & bequeath unto
 my daughter Mary Smith a feather bed with furniture to the same
 in like manner belonging to it and my Will is that she shall have
 her choice next after her brother I do hereby give & bequeath unto my
 son William Smith all my tools belonging or in any wise apper-
 taining to the Smiths trade But if my said son William ^{Smith} hap-
 pen to die then to the only use & behoof of my daughter Mary
 & her assigns I do hereby give & bequeath to my said son William
 Smith one silver watch one gunn sword one walking cane I do
 give & bequeath unto my son Francis Smith one gunn sword
 and as to the rest residue & remaind^r of all my goods chattells &
 cattells quick & dead of what kind & sorts soever that is not before
 bequeathd I do hereby give & bequeath the same to be equally dividd
 betwixt my wife Ann Smith and all my children by an equall
 dividend However it is my mind & will that noe Corn shall be
 carried of the premises but spent upon the same and lastly I
 do hereby nominate constitute & appoint my dear & wellbelovd
 daughter Mary Smith & my wife Ann Smith my true & lawfull
 ex^{ors} & my most trusty friends Mr. Nath^l Pope Sen^r & Mr. Joseph
 Bayly trustees to see this my last Will & Testament performed In
 Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seale this sixteenth day
 of February Annoq^{ue} Dni 1709 -

At a Court held for the s^d County the 26th day of
 May 1714 The last Will & Testament of Charles Smith dec^d was
 presented into Court by his relict Ann Smith who made oath thereto
 and being proved by the oaths of Henry Ward & Thomas Wooder two
 of the witnesses thereto is admit^t to record and upon motion of the said Ann
 certificate is granted her & Mary Smith for obtaining a probat thereof
 in due form -
