

Harrison No Will In the name of God amen I George Harrison of the County of Westmorland being sick & weak of body but of sound & perfect memory praised be almighty God and make this my last Will & Testament in manner & form following. Imprimis I bequeath my soul to God my heavenly father hoping by the merits of my blessed Saviour to receive it againe at the day of my resurrection Imprimis I give all my land to my sonnes Thomas George John William James & Peter & Willoughby Harrison to them & their heires for ever to be equally divided between them my sonnes George & John to have their parts where they now live and my son Willoughby to have his share where my now dwelling Plantation is further my Will is that in case any of my sons die without issue that their parts be equally divided betwixt the rest and further my Will is that in case any of my sonnes is minded to sell his part he nor none of them shall sell it to no other person but to his brother or brother who shall be willing to buy it Impr^{to} as for what worldly estate God hath given me I give & bequeath as followeth as whereas my sonnes George & John have had a bed & bott & penter I give & my will is that each of the rest of my sons have sood much and what remaineth to be equally divided betwixt them further my Will is that my son Thomas shall have a flock bed and my son Peter a flock bed and my will is that my sons William James & Willoughby have each of them a feather bed & furniture and my will is that my son Willoughby shall have this bed that I now lie upon with the quyn hangings and further my will is that every of my sonnes have what furniture belongeth to the beds and further that whereas my sons George & Peter have flock beds I give them all my geas to be equally divided between them Impr^{to} as for what cattle & shuf I have my will is that they be equally divided among all my sonnes and my will is as for what horses or mares there is that they be equally divided and as for what household stuff to be equally divided among them my said sons And as for what hoggs I have my will is that they shall be equally divided among them and further as for what nur goods is in my chest & trunk my will is that they be equally divided between my sonnes William James & Willoughby and for what wearung cloathes I have I give to my son Thomas and further my will is that all my sons after my death shall all be free to work for themselves Impr^{to} I comitt my body to the earth to be decently buried by my sonnes George and John Harrison who I made

executors of this my last Will & Testament I revoking & disannulling
all former Wills & Testaments by me made as witness my hand
and seal this second day of October anno Domini 1713

furniture belonging to it and a flock and a young Cow and a ewe &
son and a barion To my daughter Barbara Webb I give & bequeath
one Cow To my daughter Eliz. Headley I give & bequeath one mare
and a larg dish two plates a porringer a new feather bed & furniture
to it to be paid to her at the age of sixteen and a small book To my
daughter ann Headley I give & bequeath one young horse and a new
feather bed and furniture to it to be paid to her at sixteen years of
age and a young Cow a dish two plates a porringer and a small
 Pewter cup My son John Headley I make wholly & totally my ex-
ecutor & adm'r to all my estate he paying to my two sons William
Headley & Henry Headley five hundred lbs of Tobacco to each of
them so I hope to rest with God my Saviour Witness my hand
& seal this two & twentieth day of July anno Domini seventeen hundred
