his Will

In the name of God amen I George Harrison of the County of
Westmorland being sick & weak of body but of sound & perfect memory
praised be almighty God do make this my last Will & Testament in
manner & form following. Imprimis I bequeath my soul to God my
heavenly father hoping by the merits of my blessed Saviour to receive
it againe at the day of my resurrection Imprimis I give all my
land to my sons Thomas George John William James & Peter &
Willoughby Harrison to them & their heirs for ever to be equally
divided between them my sons George & John to have their parts
where they now live and my son Willoughby to have his share
where my now dwelling plantation is further my Will is that in
case any of my sons die without issue that their parts be equally
divided betwixt the rest and further my Will is that in case any of
my sons is minded to sell his part he nor none of them shall sell
it to no other person but to his brothers or brother who shall be
willing to buy it Imprimis as for what worldly estate God hath
given me I give & bequeath as followeth as whereas my sons George
& John have had a bed & chamber I give & my Will is that each
of the rest of my sons have so much and what remaineth to be
equally divided betwixt them further my Will is that my son Tho-
mas shall have a flock bed and my son Peter a flock bed and my
Will is that my sons William James & Willoughby have each of them
a feather bed & furniture and my Will is that my son Willoughby
shall have the bed that I now lie upon with the green hangings and
further my Will is that every of my sons have what furniture belong-
eth to the beds and further that whereas my sons George & Peter have
flock beds I give them all my lyes to be equally divided between them
Imprimis as for what cattle & sheep I have my Will is that they be equally
divided among all my sons and my Will is as for what horses or
mares there is that they be equally divided and as for what household
stuff to be equally divided among them my said sons and as for what
hedge I have my Will is that they shall be equally divided among them
and further as for what new goods is in my chest & trunk my Will is
that they be equally divided between my sons William James & Wil-
loughby and for what wearing cloaths I have I give to my son Thomas
and further my Will is that all my sons after my death shall all be
free to work for themselves. Imprimis I comitt my body to the earth to be
decently buried by my sons George and John Harrison who I make

executors of this my last Will & Testament I revoke & disannulling
all former Wills & Testaments by me made as witnesses my hand
and seal this second day of October anno Dni: 1713

November 1713 The last Will & testament of George Harrison was
was presented into Court by his son George who made oath thereto and
being proved by the oaths of two of the witnesses thereto is admitted to
record and upon his motion certificate is granted him for obtaining
a probat thereof in due form

In the name of God amen I, Ann Heasley being weak
and weak yet in perfect sense & memory have thought fit to make
this my last Will & Testament first I bequeath my soul to God
that gave it me body to the earth decently to be buried also my
Will is that my son Robert Heasley I give & bequeath to him one
Cott & Calfe one ewe and five hundred pounds of Tobacco to my son
William Heasley I give & bequeath one young Cott a ewe and a bar-
ron To my son Henry Heasley I give & bequeath one flock bed &
furniture belonging to it and a fott. and a young Cott and a ewe and
a baron To my daughter Barbara Webb I give & bequeath
one Cott To my daughter Eliz^a Heasley I give & bequeath one mare
and a large dish two plated a forringer a new feather bed & furniture
to it to be paid to her at the age of sixteen and a small book to my
daughter Ann Heasley I give & bequeath one young horse and a new
feather bed and furniture to it to be paid to her at sixteen years of
age and a young Cott a dish two plated a forringer and a small
pewter cupp. My son John Heasley I make wholly & solely my ex-
ecutor & adm^r to all my estate he paying to my two sons William
Heasley & Henry Heasley five hundred lbs of Tobacco to each of
them soe I hope to rest with God my saviour witnesses my hand
& seal this two & twentieth day of July anno Dni: seventeen hundred
