bequeath unto my loving sister Ann Johnson one tract of
land containing three hundred acres lying in St. Maryes County
in the Province of Maryland and now in the possession of Ri-
chard Lerris the s^d land I give to her the said Ann and her heires
for ever also I give to my said sister Ann one negro named
Jack to her & her heires for ever Item I give & bequeath to
my Godson John Newton one tract of land containing two
hundred acres lying in St. Marys County in Maryland and
now in possession of John Russell I give the said two hundred
acres of land together with the plantation to the s^d John Newton
and his heires for ever Item I give and bequeath to my Coz.
Eliz^a Wigginton one tract of land next adjoining to that which
I left to my Godson John Newton containing two hundred acres
and now in the possession of one Harbert Thomas & John Har-
dy I give the said two hundred acres of land be it more or less
to my said Coz. Elizabeth Wigginton and her heires for ever I
tem I give & bequeath unto my Coz. William Davies son to Mr.
Davies all my right title & interest of & to a Patent for thirteen

friend John Footman my riding horse saddle & bridle pistols
& holsters and sword & my fowling piece which I generally hunt
with all together with all my wearing apparel & six sheep

increase also I give to the said Stines one Cor & Calfe which said
Cor & Calfe not to be delivered to him untill he shall arrive to
the age one & twenty years. also I have lett unto John Har-
ary a parcell of land lying at the mouth of floods Creek in
St Mary's County in Maryland and part of that tract which
I bequeath to my Coy Elizabeth Wigginton and hat not given
him a lease for it but my will is that the sd John Harary
be not turned of the said land for the term of ten years
next coming he the said Harary paying five hundred pounds
of Tobacco p annum. also I make ordaine & appoint my
aforesaid loving mother Eliz^a Johnson my whole sole Ex^r of
this my last will & Testament hereby revoking & disannul-

The 7.th day of August 1712 I Daniel Marrean of Washington Parish County of Westmoreland being very sick & weak in body but of perfect mind & memory thanks be given unto God therefore calling unto mind the mortality of my body and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die doe make and ordaine this my last Will & Testament that is to say principally and first of all I give and recomend my soul unto the of God that gave it and and for my body I recomend it to the earth to be buried in a Christian like and decent manner at the discretion of my Executors nothing doubting but at the generall resurrection I shall receive the same againe by the mighty power of God and touching such the worldly estate wherewith it hath pleased God to bless me in this life I give & dispose of in the following manner and form Imp^t I give and bequeath unto my son John Marrean all & singular my land mesuage & Tenements by him freely to be possessed & enjoyed at eighteen yeares of age to him forever his one feather bed and bolster rugg & a pair of blanketts one great iron pot & pot hooks one pewter dish & one pewter plate one great chest two guns one mare about five yeares old one cow bigg with calf one heifer about three yeares old & five head of hoggs one saw and a sett of iron wedges and all my carpenters tooles.
