tural life and after her decease to return to my son James Smith
further my will is that if the Negroe girl abovesaid should bring
thre children they shall be delivered to my three daughters Jane
Smith, Anne Smith & Eliz^t Smith the first to my daughter Jane
the second to my daughter Anne the third to my daughter Elizabeth
each child to be delivered at one year old I give my son James
Smith the land wherein I now dwell which I bought of Col^l Wm.
William Pierce and the land I bought of Mr. Ed. Rousby joining to
this land to him & his heirs lawfully begotten forever but my will
is that if my son Ja. Smith should die without issue that then
the said land which I have given him to be equally divided between my
three daughters Jane Smith Anne Smith & Eliz^t Smith and their
heirs for ever my will is also that the land called Timber Neck which
I bought of Mr. John Spencer be sold by my executors for money or
tobacco to pay my debts further my will is that all the rest of my
estate be equally divided between my wife & four children James
Smith Jane Smith Anne Smith & Eliz^t Smith and do appoint my
loving wife Anne Smith executrix of this my last Will & Testament
further my will is that neither of my daughters Jane Smith and
Anne Smith & Elizabeth Smith have any part of my estate until the day

of marriage) and my will is that my son James Smith have no part of my estate until he come to the age of twenty years and now to confirm this my last will & testament I do by these presents make void all former wills by me made and do make this my last will & testament In Writings whereof I have set my hand & seal this ninth day of December one thousand seven hundred & thirteen.
