I Mary Bagge wife of J^r Bagge of Westmore County ctk. being weak in body but sound in mind and memory do make & ordain this my last Will & testament in manner & form following Viz^t Imp^t I bequeath my soul to God in hopes of salvation thro' the merits & mediation of Jesus Christ my Saviour and my body to the earth to be decently buried as my husband shall order and whereas by articles of marriage made & concluded upon by & between my aforesaid husband John Bagge & my self bearing date the 19th day of December one thousand seven hundred & eleven I have reserved the disposall of severall negroes goods & chattells to my disposall after my daughter Jane Butlers portion and part of the estate of my late husband Caleb Butler of Westmore County Gentl^e be paid as by the said articles (relation being thereunto had) may more at large appear which said negroes goods & chattells I do give dispose & bequeath in manner following ~ I Item I give & bequeath unto my son Rob^t Vauls one mourning ring and the bal^e of his bill unpaid in Mr Edward Joys hands being about five pounds ster^l with other things lent him Viz^t Mailes &c ~ I Item I order that his silver tankard

be given him when a kittle Mr. James Vaulx borrowed be returned.
 I tem I give and bequeath unto Mary the daughter of Ro-
 bert Vaulx and her heirs for ever one negroe woman named Frank
 to be delivered her the first day of November next with one pair
 her bed with pillowes sheets blanket rug & curtaines six silver
 spoones of those that are expected from Bristol this spring if they
 come safe to Virg.^a upon condition the said Robert Vaulx will
 suffer my husband to live on the plantation he now lives on one
 whole yeare after the time my daughter Jane removes from him
 he the said Vagg paying a reasonable Rent. I tem I give
 and bequeath to my son John Duddlestone and his heirs for ever
 one negroe man named Prince and one hundred pounds Sterl. I
 tem I give and bequeath to my daughter Eliz^a Porten two rings
 six silver spoones of those that are expected from Bristol this
 spring if they come safe to Virg.^a and five pounds Sterl. to her
 her heirs for ever. I tem I give to Mr. Dan^l Porten one ring
 of a Guineas price. I tem I give my daughter's Eliz^a Porten
 & Jane Butler all my worn apparell linnen & woollen to be e-
 qually divided between them as Mr^s. Ann Bayly & Mary Watts
 shall think fitt I tem I give my daughter Jane Vaulx all my
 apparell that come lately from Bristol and one new suite
 of Damask Napkins & table cloth I tem I give to my daugh-
 ter Jane Butler one negroe man named Tony to her & her heirs
 for ever & six new chaires and my emerald ring with ten sparks
 of Diamonds round the emerald I tem I give & bequeath to my
 loving husband John Vagg one negroe woman named Vincar
 to him & his heirs for ever I tem I give my said husband all the
 goods & plate (the spoones excepted) & watch that I have sent for
 to Bristol and are expected to come to hand this next spring I
 tem I give unto my loving husband John Vagg & his heirs
 for ever all that part of household goods stock & all other goods
 chattells and negroes whatsoever not already given or bequeathed
 in this Will that I had the disposal of by the aforesaid articles
 of marriage dated Decemb^r the 19th 1711 I tem I give to James
 the son of Elizabeth Jarvis the wife of John Jarvis one negroe
 child called Christmas and his heirs for ever to be delivered to

the said James his mother when the said negro shall be three
 years old and five hundred pounds of Tobacco yearly for four
 years to be laid out on the said James in schooling as his said
 mother shall think fitt and an iron pott frying pan & two penter
 basons to be delivered him when he is married of age or goes to house
 keeping in his own account I tm I constitute ordaine & appoint
 my loving husband John Bagge sole execut of this my last Will
 & Testament I tm It is my ^{flutely} that Mr. Dan^l Porten and Joseph
 Weekes doe take care that this my Will be fully performed and also
 settle & adjust all accounts between my husband and my daughter
 Jane Butler In Wittness whereof I have hereunto set my hand
 & seal this second day of February 1712 I tm I give to Wille-
 am Mosely sent if he be more living one Kersey Coat vest and
 breeches and hatt and one pair of shoes & one shirt yearly dur-
 ing his life
