 queath unto my son William one feather bed & furniture. Item
 I give & bequeath unto my son Thomas one flock bed and furniture
 Item I give & bequeath unto my dear & well beloved wife five
 head of Cattle. Item I give & bequeath unto my son William
 four head of Cattle. Item I give unto my son Thomas four
 head of Cattle. Item I give & bequeath unto my granddaughter
 one heifer of two years old. Item I give unto my son
 John one heifer of three years old. Item I give unto my
 dear & well beloved wife five head of sheep. Item I give unto
 my son John five head of sheep. Item I give unto my son
 Thomas five head of sheep. Item I give unto my dear & well
 beloved wife one horse & a mare to my wife. Item I give unto
 my son William one grey mare. Item I give unto my wife
 three dishes & four plates & one bason & one porringer. Item I give

 William seventy six acres of land with my plantation after his

I then I gave unto my son William the smaller long gunn & I then I gave unto my son Thomas the little new stock gunn and the old one to my John. I then I gave unto my sons Thomas & Wm. all my wearing cloaths equally to be divided between them two. I then I gave unto my dear & well beloved wife one new woman & the great chest and all that is in it. As witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal this seventeenth day of June in the year of our Lord God one thousand seven hundred & twelve.
