Item I give & bequeath unto my son Asman Crabb the above named Ann Davis to be and remaine with him and his hires during what tyme shee hath to serve me and doe order & appoint that he keep the estate to her above bequeathed in his hands till shee shall attain the above age of seventeen. Item I give & bequeath all & singular the rest and residue of my estate both reale & personall whatsoever or wheresoever unto my grand children the children of my two sonn's Gerrard Hunt & Asman Crabb to be equally divided amongst them all. But it is my Will & meaning and I doe hereby order & appoint that my negroe man called Samson and my stile with the appurtenances be seperated with that part of the estate which shall be divided to & for the children of my son Crabb and to be taken as part of their share or portion of the same. Lastly I constitute & appoint my dutifull son's Gerrard Hunt & Asman Crabb Ex^{rs} of this my last Will & Testament revoking by these p^{ts} all other Wills by me heretofore made.
