In the name of God Amen this fifth day of February 1709
Thomas Spence of Cape parish in the County of Westmorland being
of sound and perfect mind & memory blessed be God for the same do make
this my last Will and testament in writing. First I bequeath my soul
to Almighty God hoping in and through the merits of my dear
Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ for a free pardon and forgiveness of
all my sins and after this frail life ended of a joyfull resurrection
my body I comitt to the earth from whence it came to be decently bu-
ried and as for what worldly estate God hath in mercy blessed me
withall I give and devise as followeth first my will is that all my
just debts be paid & satisfied I then I give and devise to my son
Wm Moore that plantation and land he is now possessed withall con-
taining sixty acres and if my son Wm shall happen to die w^{out}
any heirs male lawfully begotten then the said plantation & land shall
descend to the next heirs I give and devise to my son Thomas Moore
my dwelling plantation and all the remaining part of my land and if
my said son Thomas shall happen to die without heirs male lawfully
begotten then the said plantation and land to descend to the next
heirs also I give and devise unto Marguritt Moore one heifer and
calf by her side to be delivered to the said Marguritt w^{hen} she shall
arrive to the age of eighteen years, also I make my loving wife
Marguritt Moore my whole and sole executrix of this my last
will & testament.
