Sir Esq^r my one riding horse & my gun Normen. I Give I Give to my well beloved friend W^m. Pierce my young black mare called flower & my Vicker & all her strings I Give I

Give to my friend Edward Ransdell my trap bound gunns
 formerly belonged to Capt. W^m Harbridge. Item I Give
 to my son in law Patrick Spence my pistols & hol-
 sters & brist plate. Item I Give to my son in law Thomas
 Spence my silver headed Rapier. Item I Give to Elizabeth
 Colson my old feather bed and bedstead & furniture be-
 longing to it & stuff to make her a gown & petticoate &
 a shift & a pair of shoes. Item I Give to my daughter
 Anna Thompson my one bed wherein I now lie & bedstead
 & furniture now belonging to it my will is that if my
 Daughter Alice Thompson should marry a shabby Ran-
 agate fellow she shall receive but halfe her share before
 given her and the rest to be returned to her sister my
 will is the white marsh land which I surveyed for
 Nich^s Munn which by his own offer was to give me
 halfe he having failed his offer tis my desire that
 he should pay five hundred pounds of Tobacco to my
 Ex^{rs} for survey thereof. Item it is my will & desire that
