body be decently buried and that all my just debts be duly paid
by my ex^{ors} & ad^{ors}. Item my will is that all my whole estate be
appraised in money and that it be equally divided among my eight
children and that my wife have her due part according to law. I
tem my will is that my wife have my plantation in Mattos dur-
ing her natural life & after her decease then to go to my son Wil-
liam & his heirs for ever. Item my will is all my children have
their due parts of my estate when they shall come to age or at the
day of marriage. Item my will is that my wife have the man-
agement of all my estate for the good of herself & children during
her widowhood and if it should so happen that she should
alter her condition before my children come of age or married that
then she give good security to the Court for their parts of the estate
Item my will is that all my Tobacco on my plantations be sold to
the best advantage and all my family to furnished with what is need-
full for their use for this present yeare and the remainder to be managed
for the good of my wife & children as aforesaid Item my will is that
Joseph Bayly and Ann Bayly his wife have a mourning ring.
Item my will is that my loving wife Eliz^a Markham & Joseph
Bayly be the ex^{ors} & ad^{ors} of this my last will & Testament. As wit-

I John attwells of Cople parish in the County of Westm^{ts} being sick & weak in body but of sound & perfect sense & memory (thanks to God for the same) calling to mind the uncertainty of this transitory life doe make here my will and testament in manner & form following: I Imprimis I give and bequeath to my son Thomas attwells my plantation housing and appurtenances where Phillip Combs now lives being part of the dividend of land whereon I now live to him my said son Thomas and his heirs for ever. Item I give & bequeath to my son Youell attwells my plantation housing & appurtenances where S^r Southerland now lives being part of my dividend of land where I now live to him my said son Youell and his heirs for ever. Item I give and bequeath to my son Samuel attwells my plantation whereon I now live being the remainder of my aforesaid dividend together with the members & appurtenances unto the same belonging to him my said son Samuel & his heirs for ever. Item it is my will & meaning that my whole aforesaid dividend of land shall be equally laid out in three parts including in each part one of the above mentoned plantations and that each & every of my above named sons enjoy & hold their parts as above bequeathed together with a third part of my said land which shall be most comodious and advantageous to each & every of their said plantations to them and their heirs forever. and further it is my will & desire that if either of my above mentoned sons should die without issue lawfully to be begott and before they attain the age of twenty one yeares that then his part to
