iam & his heirs forever. Item my will is all my children have
their due parts of my estate when they shall come to age or at the
day of marriage. Item my will is that my wife have the man-
agement of all my estate for the good of herself & children during
her widowhood and if it should ever happen that she should
alter her condition before my children come of age or married that
then she give good security to the Court for their parts of the estate
Item my will is that all my tobacco on my plantations be sold to
the best advantage and all my family to furnished with what is need-
full for their use for this present year and the remainder to be manage^d
for the good of my wife & children as aforesaid Item my will is that
Joseph Bayly and Ann Bayly his wife have a mourning ring.
Item my will is that my loving wife Eliz^a Markham & Joseph
