 John have given granted bargained & sold unto the
 said John & his heirs forever that Tract of Land lying

 hundred Acres be the same more or less bounded by the
 Lands of Triplett, Dickman, Rice & Tacte, and all
 Houses water courses and other purposes thereunto belonging
 and appertaining To have and to hold the said
 premises hereby bargained & sold or intended so to be to
 him the said John & his heirs for ever free from the

 Benjamin for himself his heirs Exors & Adm^{rs} do hereby
 covenant promise and agree to and with him the said
 John his heirs Exors & Adm^{rs} that he hath in himself
 good & lawfull right to sell & dispos^e of the said Tract or
 parcel of Land ~~for himself his heirs Exors & Adm^{rs}~~ and that it
 is free from all or any kind of Incumbrance whatsoever
 And he will make & execute all further & other necessary
 instruments of writing to the said John as may be thought
 more effectual in securing a sure title to the said Land
