be to be Levin Bennett Garlick or his assigns to his or their discretion to do as
he or they think best with this indent made in the year of our
said god one thousand seven hundred and seventy six it being
the first year of the stile of the common wealth of Virginia the twenty
Eight day 1776

and I do agree to give him three barrels of corn and a shoot and too yards of cloth
for his living this in swing year and half my crop of fodder and rotten corn
of the stock above mentioned given under my hand and seal
it and delivered in presence of
