Remission of all my Sins and my Body I commit to the Earth to be  
decently buried at the discretion of my Executor hereafter named and  
as to what worldly Estate I am possessed of I Give and bequeath as followeth  
Item I Give and bequeath all my Estate of what Nature or kind so  
ever unto Benjamin Waller of the City of Williamsburgh Esq<sup>r</sup>. in Trust  
to Sell and dispose of the same and out of the Money arising from the  
Sale thereof in the first Place to pay all my just Debts and funeral  
Charges and if there shall be any Overplus then in Trust to keep the  
same until my Son John Hilliard shall Arrive to the Age of twenty one  
Years and then to pay and deliver the same to my said Son to his own  
proper Use and behoof But it is my Will that if my Circumstances  
will afford it the Bed whereon I lie and furniture be not sold but

given and deliver'd unto my said Son immediately after my Death And  
that out of the Residue of the Money aforesaid a Ring of the Value  
of ten shillings be bought by my Executor and given unto Mary  
Bowcock Daughter of M<sup>rs</sup> Eliz<sup>a</sup> Lowe Bowcock as an Acknowledgment  
of the many favours I have rec<sup>d</sup> from the said M<sup>rs</sup> Bowcock.  
And Lastly I do appoint the said Benjamin Waller Executor of this my  
last Will and Testament hereby revoking all former Wills by me made  
and desire that my said Executor may not be obliged to give Security  
for my Estate In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and  
affix'd my Seal this 5<sup>th</sup> Day of February 1746.
