calling to mind that it is appointed for all Persons once to dye For
what Estate God hath endued me with I give and bequeath in
manner and form as following first I recommend my Soul to God
that gave it me not doubting but at the resurrection to receive the
same again and as for my Body I bequeath to the Earth from whence it

it came and as for my Estate I give and bequeath in manner and form following I myself I give and bequeath to my loving Wife Sarah Jackson all my whole Estate Personal and Real during her Natural Life or her Widowhood and for what Estate there is at the day of her death or the day of Marriage to be Sold Land and Negroes if there be any by Lips Jackson Benjamin Eggleston William Granger or any one of them and a twelve months Credit to be given and the money to be equally divided amongst all my Children I leave my loving Wife my whole and sole Executor to this my last Will and Testament during her life or Widowhood In Witnes whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 19th day of January 1755.
